
Alleman Football Builds for the Future


Coach Bollman Named 2023 State Coach of the Year

Alleman School Board Update

Since the inaugural meeting in November of 2022, the Alleman Catholic High School Board has been hard at work in its role as a consultative body to the Alleman administration. The Board established standing committees for academics, advancement, Catholic identity, enrollment, facilities, finance, governance, and student life. These committees have allowed us to engage many talented and passionate members of the greater Alleman community. Through regular Board and Committee meetings, we strive to provide the support and resources our administration and faculty need to enhance the Alleman tradition of academic success and extracurricular excellence in a faith-based learning environment.

- Successfully advocated for Diocesan approval of a base pay raise for teachers and staff.
- Enrollment efforts resulted in a 19% increase in this year's freshmen class.
- Spearheaded coordination between Alleman affiliated partner school sports, including the creation of the Quad Cities' first middle school golf team. Coming soon: new One Family logo and events bringing together Alleman, Seton, Jordan, and Grace.
- Launched an ad hoc committee among all Illinois Quad Cities Catholic schools to maximize shared resources and explore consolidation models.
- Promoted greater student participation in campus ministry and school Masses and support return of daily Mass with our new Chaplain, Father Patrick Willie.
- Assisted administration with Advancement Office reorganization and hiring as well as supporting fundraising initiatives, including the 50th Annual Fr. Mirabelli Heritage Ball.
- Conducted comprehensive reviews of counseling and athletic departments.
- Instituted seasonal volunteer facilities and grounds clean up days and developed master improvement list.

In order to better understand the needs of Alleman Catholic High School, the Alleman Board is inviting current Alleman students and parents, as well as faculty and staff to complete surveys that were recently provided to them. The Board is also seeking the input of parents of our partner schools (Seton, Jordan, and Our Lady of Grace) to better understand their needs prior to their sons and daughters join us at Alleman.

Students Attend Naturalization Ceremony

Alleman students attended a Naturalization Ceremony at Centennial Hall on the campus of Augustana College that was presided over by the Honorable Sara Darrow, Chief United States District Judge for the Central District of Illinois. Judge Darrow also serves as President of the Alleman School Board.

Naturalization ceremonies are the final step of the process for a foreign citizen or national to become a U.S. citizen. During the ceremony, approximately 86 immigrants from 16 countries took the Oath of Allegiance and were sworn in as new U.S. citizens. Alleman students were joined for the ceremony by students from Seton Catholic School, Jordan Catholic School, and Our Lady of Grace Catholic Academy. Recent essay and art contest winners from the schools were present on stage and Alleman students led the singing of the National Anthem. Our Alleman School Board was also present on stage along with Dr. Susan Miller, Superintendent of Catholic Schools for the Diocese of Peoria and other dignitaries. We are all honored to have been part of such a momentous day!

The Class of 1983 celebrated their reunion with a return to the halls of Alleman this past August!




Pray for Our Seminarians


